## Second Place Just Isn't Good Enough

#### Led By Megen Donovan, Wood Looks To Take Catholic League Title

She may practice with the team only five times a month, but Megen Donovan may be the key to leading the Archbishop Wood girls swimming team to a Catholic League title.

The Towson-bound senior, who signed a letter of intent with the Tigers two weeks ago, hopes her experience and success on the team last year will rub off on the other swimmers.

"I never really thought that I was one of the go-to girls on the team," said Donovan, who swims for the club team, NRG Swimming, year-round. "I feel special when the girls can look to me for advice, but this team has so much raw talent that they don't need much more advice to

The Vikings, led by Donovan and fellow club swimmer senior Jackie Smith, who will swim for Division III Washington and Lee next year, finished second in the Catholic League last year behind Archbishop Ryan.

Donovan won the 500-meter breast stroke last season, while Smith took the 200 freestyle. Wood also won the team 200meter freestyle.

But to come in second place is quite a feat when you consider the fact that Donovan and Smith were Wood's only two club swimmers, while Ryan's squad had at least 20.

"Some of the credit has to go to Megen and Jackie," said Wood coach Charlie Stillwell. "Having them on the team just makes everyone step up and work harder towards our goal."

Donovan began swimming competitively in seventh grade. She wakes up at 5 a.m. three days a week in order to train with NRG in Langhorne. She then travels back to Warminster for school, before heading back to Langhorne for another practice session.

"I was thrown in the water at 8 (years-old)," Donovan said, "and have loved it ever since."

The goal for the Vikings this

year is to get over the hump and win the championship, and Stillwell said even though the team lost four seniors that scored points for them last season, he still thinks he has a stronger group of swimmers this year that could help the team get

Besides Donovan, who will swim most breaststroke and freestyle events, and Smith, who will swim in freestyle, butterfly and backstroke events, Wood has several strong underclassmen who could grab some victories for the team over the season.

Junior Christina Rios is expected to compete for wins in the 50-meter backstroke, while junior Amy Finn is expected to be the team's top butterflyer. She placed fourth in the championship last year.

Sophomore Alise Davis, who Stillwell described as a strong all-around swimmer, will be a top breast-stroker for Wood, as well as in the individual medley

And freshmen Emily Smith Jackie's younger sister - and Bridget Keirins should both pull in some points in a variety of different events, Stillwell said.

Stillwell said the team's strength will be in the freestyle

"If you have good freestylers, you can go far," Stillwell said. "We're stronger and have a lot more depth across the board. I think we have the better swimmers this year."

But Donovan is clearly the top swimmer in the league, according to Stillwell, which explains why she will swim for a Division I school. Donovan said she expects to compete for a spot on one of the mid-distance freestyle squads at Towson.

Wood will face Ryan in a head-to-head meet on Jan. 10 at home. It is then that the Vikings will find out what their chances are to dethrone the champs.

"It's going to be close, but we have a pretty good team this year," Donovan said. "But I'm confident we can take them."



# Phila. Catholic League makes move to join PIAA

For years, the question lingered: When will the Philadelphia Catholic League teams be able to compete for a state title?

Yesterday, that question was finally answered.

Bishop Joseph McFadden, who heads Catholic Education for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, announced at a news conference that the 17 Catholic League schools under the jurisdiction of the Archdiocese will petition to join the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association by July 1.

During its first year of membership, the Catholic League will transition into the PIAA — abiding by its rules — but will not participate in the state playoffs. In July 2008, the Catholic League will become full members and will be eligible for postseason play in the 2008-09 school year.

Even with the addition of the Catholic League, the PIAA is not considering having separate private and public championships, a practice New Jersey employs, according to Brad Cashman, PIAA executive director.

"I think the moment is now," said McFadden, who added: "Shouldn't our student-athletes have the same opportunity to exhibit their abilities at the highest level?"

The news gathering was held

at School District of Philadelphia headquarters on North Broad Street. The Catholic League will join the PIAA as a member of District 12, which is currently comprised solely of Public League teams.

Besides giving the Catholic League time to adjust its sports calendars and prepare for the monstrous move, the transition year was necessary because the Public League had a stipulation with the PIAA which forbid any non-Public school from entering District 12 until July 2008.

The 10 Catholic League schools located within the city limits will individually apply for membership through District 12, while the seven suburban schools will file paperwork with District 1, as PIAA rules require, simultaneously requesting a transfer to District 12.

District 1 covers the four counties surrounding Philadelphia.

Missing from the proceedings were the two Catholic League members that are not governed by the Archdiocese — St. Joseph's Prep and La Salle. Although McFadden wouldn't speak for the two full private schools, he did believe they would follow the Archdiocese and apply to the PIAA.

A statement from the Prep said as much: "The chance to compete for a state title in addition to a league title is very intriguing and we hope that it will work out in the best interest of the students and athletes of St. Joseph's Prep."

The reason for keeping the Catholic League schools within the same district was to keep the 86-year-old Catholic League intact. Although there remains a grand amount of reorganization, the league plans to keep its championships.

If all goes according to plan, the "historical partnership" — as McFadden called it — between the Catholic and Public Leagues will at least bring back a variation of the City Title series that was discontinued during the 1979-80 school year. That year, Lurline Jones, the girls' basketball coach at University City, filed a lawsuit to allow the girls' teams — which were excluded — to participate in the series. This time, however, the girls' teams will be included.

"We're working on that structure and that will take some effort," said Marge Weustner, executive director of health, safety and physical education for the School District of Philadelphia. "We're committed."

"It's very clear right now in the Catholic League policies and procedures that you are not to recruit to athletes to your school," McFadden said.

Schools that offer athletic scholarships will have to abandon that practice.

# Wood sets sights on PCL title

"We definitely think we can make a run at it this year," Smith said. "Last year, we did really well, and I think that set us up as a team to be reckoned with this year. This year, we have a good incoming class who can help us.

Smith hopes to continue her swimming career at Division III Washington and Lee in Lexington, Va.

# PCL seeks to join PIAA

Monumental.

That is really the only word to describe the announcement that will change Philadelphia High School sports as we know it.

On Monday, at the School District of Philadelphia building located right in the heart of North Broad Street, officials from the Philadelphia Catholic League (PCL), Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, (PIAA), and state representative Gene DiGirolamo gathered to announce a decision people have been awaiting for some time now.

The PCL effective July 1, 2008, will officially join District 12, becoming a member of the PIAA. The decision was made by a joint committee consisting of Rev. Joseph McFadden (Auxiliary Bishop of the PCL), Bradley Cashman (PIAA executive director), Paul Vallas (School District of Philadelphia CEO), and Martin Bednarek (Commissioner of the School Reform Commission).

The move will allow Catholic League teams to compete in state run tournaments, whereas, before in the past, seasons would end after a league championship game.

Marjorie Weustner, executive director of the Office of Health, Safety, Physical Education and Sports Administration at the School District of Philadelphia, coordinated the press conference.

McFadden, Cashman, DiGirolamo, and Bednarek all spoke with enthusiasm over the groundbreaking news.

"The Philadelphia Catholic League has an 86 year tradition of excellence on and off the field of play," McFadden said. "We believe that this partnership advances those years of tradition and will positively affect the students of the Philadelphia region. This is a historic partnership."

Bednarek spoke of unity.

"Now we have the city coming together," he said, "I think District 12 will now be one of the toughest districts in the state. Wouldn't it be great to say 'not

only are we the Philadelphia champion, but the state champion as well."

DiGirolamo, a 1968 graduate of Bishop Egan (now Conwell-Egan Catholic) called the decision a "win-win situation for everyone involved," and turned to a group of students in attendance saying, "You will be making history."

District 12 is comprised of 58 schools, 45 public high schools and 13 charter schools. The addition of the PCL will bring the total to 75, with St. Joseph's Prep and La Salle's futures still up in the air. The idea has been floated around that those schools may join the Inter-Ac League, but no decision as of right now has been made. The two schools could also compete as independents, but what is certain is that La Salle and The Prep have to file admission to the PIAA separate of the Archdiocese. Some have even hinted the Inter-Ac league may follow in the PCL's footsteps, and as Cashman pointed out, "the PIAA is about including everyone, and excluding no

one.

The members of the committee all acknowledge this will be a work in progress over the next couple of years, but feel in the grand scheme of things, the decision will not only benefit the individuals and schools, but the city as well.





The schools boast some of the top swimmers in the country and entered Easterns eager to set records and win medals. Both squads surpassed the hype, but in the end it was Peddie that powered its way to boys and girls team titles, matching the feat GA accomplished a year ago.

PHILADELPHIA — There is an old cliché that there is only one winner in any competition. It's not true.

Germantown Academy couldn't quite match up with the Peddie School, but coach Dick Shoulberg was ecstatic with second-place finishes in both the boys and girls competition at the Eastern Independent School Swimming and Diving Championships at La Salle University's Kirk Pool Saturday night.

"The boys were outstanding," Shoulberg said after the meet concluded. "Every boy had at least one lifetime best, and they swam as a team and

achieved.

"They far exceeded my expectations. They won five of the 11 events, and this is the smallest (boys) team that I ever had.

"My girls were solid. They never reached their total (goals), and I don't know why. I'm perplexed, but I guess we'll have to go back to the drawing board. Hats off to the Peddie School."

The boys were in third place after Friday's events and moved up a notch on Saturday to close the gap against Peddie, which won the meet with 413 points. Behind GA (336) were Loyola Blakefield (324.5), Malvern Prep (306) and La Salle (263).

The girls were in second place going into Saturday's events and held their place. The top five girls schools were Peddie (659), GA (613), Mercersburg Academy (221), Mount de Sales Academy (173) and Episcopal Academy (148)

#### **Swimming**

The boys were helped before Saturday night's finals when Tom Henninger and Jeff Craig collected 45 points by placing first and second, respectively, in the diving competition, which was held earlier in the day.

Then Reece Chandler and Matt Cox did likewise in the 500 freestyle. And Chandler, the fourth seed, won it by taking more than six seconds off of his qualifying time of 4:41.03. His winning time was 4:34.38.

"This morning, I really didn't give it my all," said Chandler. "I wanted to give my best shot tonight, so I guess I was kind of saving something for tonight. I got off to a good start and just kept it up. I'm pleased with my time, and I'm ecstatic with my teammates. Two years ago, (Cox and I) were first and second in the 500, so it was great that we did it again."

Cox had won the 200 individual medley on Friday.

Shoulberg has long had a reputation for coaching distance events, and the best example of that was when teammates Teresa Crippen, Lauren Sylvester and Abby Reilly took the top three places, respectively, in the girls 500 freestyle. On Friday, junior Teresa had outdueled her older sister, Claire, to win the individual medley.

"Me and my sister are always in competition," said Teresa Crippen on Saturday. "I always know that I'm going to get a good run out of her. She's going to college, so besides nationals, this is probably our last high school meet together. She's always been with me, so it's going to be different for me next year."

Both sisters, as well as some of their teammates, made qualifying times for nationals, which will be held on Long Island at the end of March.

In other events, Katie Riefenstahl (50.58), who won the 200 freestyle on Friday, was touched out by Peddie's Amywren Miller (50.46) in the 100 freestyle. Miller was later named the outstanding swimmer in the girls competition.

Heading into the last event, GA knew that it couldn't make up make up the difference in points to overcome Peddie, but the girls certainly let Peddie know that they were giving it their best shot.

The team of Teresa Crippen, Katie Magee, Claire Crippen and Riefenstahl took the 400 freestyle with a time of 3:25.74, more than seven seconds ahead of second-place Peddie (3:32.89).

"That was the fastest time in the country this year (for the 400 freestyle relay)," said Shoulberg. "We still hold the national record."

The Patriots set that mark last year with a 3:22.34.

Elsewhere from the area, Archbishop Wood finished in 12th place in the girls meet. Megen Donovan had the highest finish for the Vikings by placing ninth in the 500 freestyle. Wood boys didn't have anyone qualify for the final three heats.
